

## Production test results give Inzeco green light on road to commercialization

---

**Stoney Creek, ON, November 19, 1999:** Continuous production outputs up to 100 kg per hour for RTICA™ brand insulation have been achieved with the company's proprietary technology, reports RTICA Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Inzeco Holdings Inc., located in Stoney Creek, Ontario.

RTICA™ is a high-performance, fibrous insulation material derived from 100% recycled PET, a plastic polymer commonly used in the manufacture of soft drink bottles, plastic film and textiles.

"These output levels are 50% higher than planned and clearly demonstrate our technology's ability to convert polymer feed stock to fibres that meet RTICA specifications," says plant manager Bill Worden. "Our focus now is to raise output to reach the company's initial target of 4 houses per day, with all line systems in place and functioning smoothly."

The availability of product now enables the company to advance the building code approval process to the next step. The specification for RTICA™ insulation has been finalized with National Research Council Construction Material Centre. Certain market development projects will also be undertaken subject to local building officials' consent.

RTICA represents a new generation of insulation that adds exceptional value to housing and commercial building projects. It is cost-efficient, totally worker-friendly and contributes significantly to post-consumer waste recycling efforts.
